The history of the freedom movement in India has a unique place in the evolution of contemporary South Asia. Pre-partition India was the size of the present day India, Pakistan and Bangladesh putting together in one place. It has not only ignited the flame of independence in the region, but also impacted the subjugated nations in different parts of the world. Nehru, Tito and Nasser representing three diverse regions, helped build an international movement for restructuring the bi-polar world for the advantage of the downtrodden. The movement they built came to be known as Nonalignment. These renaissance leaders were of the opinion that freedom within could become durable If it is substantiated by the spread of freedom world over. The story of the framing of the Indian constitution talked about the roots of freedom in a country characterized by multiple castes, steep poverty, discriminatory social structures and uneven distribution of capital.

Caste lies at the heart of backwardness of the Indian society. The relationship between caste and poverty seems to be of a symbiotic nature. They reinforce each other. The inextricably intertwined phenomena of caste and poverty is so well entrenched that it has failed to recede even after the adoption of measures of economic reform in 1991. On the contrary, the latter has further strengthened the anti-democracy nexus between caste and poverty in the country. The capital intensive and profit driven model of neoliberal market- economy has, in fact, not only flared up the old, dormant caste contradictions in India, but also given rise to the new ones between Dalits and various 'Backward and Other Backward Classes' that have mushroomed in the post-Mandal era. Though the neoliberal market-economy has been promising to provide ample space to the socially excluded sections of society by opening new and unrestrained opportunities for them in the fast emerging domain of free market economy in India, the reality is the other way round. The neoliberal free market economy has failed to ward off the contagious effect of the hoary and exclusionary institution of caste in India.

It was in this crucial context that Babasaheb Dr B.R Ambedkar made caste the prime focus of his lifelong structure for its annihilation. For him capitalism and Brahminism were the two main enemies. By Brahminism he did not mean any particular person but a thinking based on discrimination and backwardness. He was of the firm view that true freedom will dawn on India in the aftermath of the annihilation of the caste system. His entire life was a great life devoted for this very purpose. The India of 21 century can really be an Azad Bharat only and only if it can get itself completely rid of the mess of caste and caste based orientations. 
