

Relevance of The Teachings of Tathagat Buddha In Contemporary Times

Teachings of Buddha are based on his long journey on the unknown path of self-realization a path which everyone has to search for oneself. One has to lit one's own Tathagat lamp! Buddha began his search for an answer to an eternal question: Why one encounters dukha (suffering - physical, mental, moral & social). He aban-

doned his palace and sought the company of recluses of his time. His sufferings did not emerge from any scarcity of material resources or physical ailments. In fact, It was the outcome of subtle realization on his part after a chance encounter of sickness, old age, and death - a realization that nothing is permanent in this world. It went so deep into his mind that if someone faces sickness, turned old and become dead then this will also be the fate of every human being irrespective of his status, age and place including his very self. Though Buddha was neither sick, nor old but his encounter with the sufferings of others made him convinced that every human being will pass through all such stages and finally has to face death. Such a realization forced him to renounce his palacial living, King father, beautiful wife, a very small son and to live a mendicant life full of self-invited sufferings. He began his search for the emancipation of sufferings of all sorts outside the palace and in the company of the known renouncers. He did what was told to do to attain the 'truth'. He practiced every formula, yogic exercise and put himself to self-severe physical afflictions to the extent of turning his body frame into a mere skeletal. Living for days just on a single grain. None did work. Finally, it became clear to him that answer to suffering cannot be found outside. It might have occurred to him that how come an answer to sufferings that experienced within could be located in the outer-world? This led him to chart a new journey in search of the 'truth' - a journey within his very self. It also made him realize that on this journey, the best way is the middle way - in between extreme indulgence and total renunciation! But what distinguished Tathagat Buddha from all other practioners of spiritual way of finding truth is his scientific approach to know 'thyself'. He taught us there is dukha in life. It has a cause. The cause can be tracked down. And the answer to get rid of that has to be found.

Another insight of the realized truth that he shared with the humanity is that all human beings are same. There is no upper and lower caste. Freedom, equality and social justice are the fundamental foundations for such a journey to launch within by each one of us. Sufferings begin in craving and it never ends at any stage of life. The only exit is to lit one's own lamp within. Babasaheb Dr B.R. Ambedkar found the noble way to the emancipation and empowerment of the lower castes in embracing Buddhism, which for him not a religion of rituals but of social justice, freedom and equality. It taught us to struggle for salvation through our own efforts. It did not ask for any mediator between the sufferers and the God. It called upon us to understand what caused our suffering and to find a way out. The way he suggested is: Educate, Agitate, and Organize!

Floral Tribute to Sh. R.C. Goel (18 May 1933 - 29 April 2023)

R 18 May 1933 - 29 April 2023) had the honour to watch from close quarters the seeding and growth of the Panjab University in Indian Punjab after its tragic divide along with the bloody partition of the country in the wake of Indian independence. He was in Lahore during the carnage and was able to save his life, as he told me, hiding behind the shoe racks in the showroom of the Bata Shoe company (BSC) in the capital city of Lahore. His family was closely connected with the clan of Sir Ganga Ram, a reputed architect, iconic engineer, and philanthropist, who carries a vivid legacy across the borders. The grand-daughter (Raj Gupta) of Sir Bhagat Ram, brother of Sir Ganga Ram, was married to Parkash Chand Gupta, elder brother of R.C. Goel. His father, Lala Suraj Bhan had a brisk business, exchanging apples with dry fruits, between Barog (HP) and Lahore. After the loss of his father's business during the partition, R.C. Goel joined Panjab University (Solan Campus), at very young age, to chip in his income. During his long service in Panjab University (PU), he had the distinction of working with many Vice-Chancellors - Suraj Bhan, R.C. Paul, R. P. Bambah and T.N. Kapoor. He was the first holder of the post of Officer on Special Duty (OSD) in the office of Vice-Chancellor, primarily created in recognition of his meticulous service and the same continued to exist after his retirement in 1993. He is survived by his wife, two daughters and a Son. All of them are now serving at different educational and administrative positions. His son is an engineer. His wife, who is also ninety now, is a graduate and comes from a reputed lawyers' family. One of her nieces is a serving judge in a high court in the country.

After the construction of the PU Campus in the capital city of Chandigarh, R.C. Goel took up his residence in Chandigarh, which also housed his parents, some of his nephews and nieces, two daughters and a son. He brought his nephews to live with him to provide them better education facilities made available in the newly established Capital of Punjab, later the capital of two states: Punjab and Haryana. However, despite busy office schedule and large

R.C. Goel also had a lasting passion for writing. He began writing at the end of 1948, immediately after passing

his matriculation examination. In those days, he used to contribute short stories in Urdu Newspapers. Soon after, he started writing short write ups on topically and socially relevant themes for varied Newspapers: Indian Express, The Statesman, The Pioneer, The Tribune, Hindustan Times, The National Herald, Chandigarh Newsline, and popular journals: Niti, Art of Living, and Yuva Bharat. He loved discussing current national and international issues and used to watch news channels and debates on TV screen. He lived long life full of vigor and contentment. Even during the last days of his mortal journey that he spent in a hospital because of old-age related common ailments, his habitual smile playing on his lips. He was deeply health conscious and meticulous about the quality, quantity and timings of his meals. His strict diet regimen and regular Yoga exercise, said his doctors, could have helped him to survive on ventilator in the hospital for almost a month-long duration.

Ramesh Chand Goel lived a very simple and calm life. Whenever I went to meet him, I found him welldressed and active. He never indulged in talking about bygone time and others. His best advice used to be: never miss your routine walk, must concentrate on Akal Purakh, though for a short while, and help the needy. He was fond of home-made food and talking about current national and international affairs. He will be remembered for his many good deeds and gregarious nature.



It is a universal fact of life that everybody in flesh and bones has to go sooner or later but the immortality of soul is eternal. Though Mr. Goel lived a long and an abun-



Bedford Celebrates Dr Ambedkar's Birthday



















To celebrate the 132nd birth anniversary of Dr Ambedkar, on 30th April, 2023, a function was arranged jointly by the Ambedkar Mission Society (AMS), Shri Guru Ravidass Sabha (SGRS) and BhagwanValmik Sabha (BVS), Bedford, at the Shri Guru Ravidass Community Centre Bedford. Keeping in view the Local Council Election in Bedford on 4 May 2023, this function became very significant as the candidates for the election had an opportunity to share their point of view on a number of issues that affected the community. A number of councillors from different political parties participated.

Jaswinder Kumar, President, SGRS welcomed everybody and said that Bedford is the only town in whole of the UK that all these organisations are working together and have been celebrating Babasaheb's birthday jointly for a number of years. As a result of joint efforts by Ravidassi, Ambedkarite and Valmiki communities, a man was charged for the hate speech on social media and got 18 months imprisonment and a £240 fine. He used derogatory and casteist remarks against the Ravidassi and Jaswinder Valmiki Communities. said "Whenever such incidents happen we get together and take action". Prithavi Randhawa, General Secretary, SGRS termed Ambedkar as an iconic figure who sacrificed whole of his life for the welfare of humanity. TarlokGharu, President, BVS also spoke about the contribution of Dr Ambedkar to uplift the conditions of supressed people of India.

Arun Kumar, General Secretary of AMS talked about the recently published book 'Ambedkar in London' co-edited and co-authored by Dr William Gould, Ms Santosh Dass MBE and Dr Christophe Jaffrelot. This book explores the lessor known facts about Dr Ambedkar's time at the London School of Economics, Grav's Inn, Round Table Conference (1930-32) and during his visit in 1946. It also explores his legacy in matters of the anti-caste and Ambedkarite movements in the UK. The book includes a detailed account of the purchase and converting into an Ambedkar Museum, 10 King Henry's Road property where Dr Ambedkar stayed during his studies at the LSE and Gray's Inn. He further added that he was honoured to share a chapter with Santosh Dass. Arun expressed his happiness that our proposal to declare Babasahaeb's birthday as an equality day is getting wider support. In India, state government of Tamil Nadu and a number of city councils in Canada, America and here in Coventry have declared 14 April, Dr Ambedkar's birthday as a day of equality. He hoped that all councillors here in Bedford would also support this proposal and hopefully next year we would be celebrating Dr Ambedkar's birthday in

Council Chambers as a day of equality.

Mohammad Yasin MP spoke about the discrimination Dr Ambedkar faced in his life and chose to fight the prejudice. He added "Dr Ambedkar is credited for the drafting of the Indian Constitution in which he made provisions for eradicating this evil of caste discrimination". Mohammad Yasin said he fully support the legislation against caste discrimination in the UK, even he raised the question in the Parliament.

Councillor PinderChauhan, parliamentary candidate from Bedford, was happy to see that the Ravidassi, Valmiki and Ambedkarite communities are working together and celebrating Dr Ambedkar's life and his works together.

She said "Dr Ambedkar fought against caste discrimination and was ardent feminist. He saw that women were marginalised in society and brought provisions of equality through education, employment, social and economic rights. It is due to Dr Ambedkar's legislative reforms that today women in India can be self-dependent".

Ram Pal Rahi, Vice President, Federation of Ambedkarite& Buddhist Organisations, UK (FABO) said "Dr Ambedkar is generally considered as a Dalit leader. It is not true. When Dr Ambedkar talks about equality, liberty and fraternity, it is not for one section of society. It's for everybody. By giving the wonderful Constitution and the Hindu Code bill, he has transformed the lives of millions of men and women of

India".



For the first time to mark the 125th birth anniversary of Babasaheb Ambedkar, our PMI to the UN in New York observed the day at the UN on April 14, 2016 in which a semi-official delegation headed by Sardar Charanjit Singh Atwal participated and mentioned about the proposal on International Day of Equality in his speech which was highly appreciated and acclaimed not only at the meeting at the UN but also by the followers of Ambedkar in India and abroad. On return, Atwal Sahib in a letter in May, 2016 to PM Narendra Modi, briefed him about the UN meeting on Ambedkar and informed him that the proposal on International Day of Equality was duly registered by him and requested the PM to kindly take up the matter by way of an official demarche to the UN to honour the icon equality, Babasaheb of Ambedkar.

Since then, we have been pursuing the matter with all concerned not with any agitational approach but with a suggestive and harmonious intent. Forum of Schedule Caste MPs and MLAs also submitted a Memorandum to the then Mahamahim Rashtrapati Ram Nath Kovind also in the course of follow up of the matter. But it is a matter of regret and concern that GOI has not shown any visible interest in the proposal to date. GOI, under the leadership of PM Narendra Modi, has done many things internally in the country to recognize and honour Babasaheb. It is surprising that as to why the GOI is indifferent to the proposal which very well serves the twin purpose of

With a view to revisit the subject, I wrote again on May 6 to remind EAM, Dr. S. Jaishankar with the hope to get some positive response. The letter is appended below for information and perusal.

Through this open letter, I would like to request the BJP leadership to kindly consider and urge the BJP Government of PM Narendra Modi to kindly consider and take an early decision to make a diplomatic demarche to the UN to declare April 14, birthday of Babasaheb Ambedkar as International Day of Equality. 
